**Rhinebeck contractor earns energy reduction awards** — The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority recognized Malcarne Contracting Inc. of Rhinebeck for outstanding energy-saving projects through the authority's Multifamily Performance Program. Malcarne was honored for savings on two newly constructed buildings, earning silver and bronze awards in the Outstanding Savings Award category. The projects were the 62-unit Birches at Chambers project in Kingston, which reduced energy use by 39 percent for an annual savings of \$41,334, and the 65-unit Birches at Esopus project, which reduced energy use by 36 percent for an annual savings of \$26,381.
